- The Intermediate and Transition programs are for students who can participate independently or with minimal support.
- Each program has a limited number of available spots for this program. A wait list will be kept in the case of cancellations.
- Students will be served meals on campus and will be housed in the WSBVI dorms. (Housing not provided for the Beginning Literacy program.)
- Transportation to and from the WSBVI campus is the responsibility of the family.
- This program is not part of a student's IEP or any local district programming.

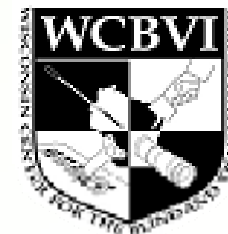

June 25-30

Intermediate Literacy

Ages 8-13

- 📍 A one-week literacy-focused scavenger hunt experience for Wisconsin students who are blind or visually impaired aged 8-13.
- 📍 There are up to 20 available spots for this program.
- 📍 Students will be separated into teams and be given a list of tasks to complete / items to find.
- 📍 Students, under the supervision of staff, may leave campus to complete these tasks.
- 📍 Students will also learn about independence, working in groups, traveling in unfamiliar areas, cooking, how to integrate technology with every day activities and when and how to ask for assistance.



July 9-21

Transition

Ages 14-21

- 📍 A two-week transition-focused scavenger hunt experience for Wisconsin students who are blind or visually impaired aged 14-21.
- 📍 There are up to 20 available spots for this program.
- 📍 Students will be separated into teams and be given a list of tasks to complete / items to find.
- 📍 To aid in these tasks, students will participate in classes such as: Career and Vocational Education, Independent Living and Personal Management, Self Advocacy, Orientation & Mobility, Social Interaction
- 📍 Students, under the supervision of staff, may leave campus to complete these tasks.



August 1-4

Beginning Literacy

Ages 4-7

[Day program]

- 📍 A literacy-focused scavenger hunt experience for Wisconsin students who are blind or visually impaired aged 4-7.
- 📍 This is a **day program** only. Students should arrive at 9 am and be picked up at 3 pm. Daily transportation is the responsibility of the family.
- 📍 There are up to 6 available spots for this program.
- 📍 Students will be given a list of tasks to complete / items to find.
- 📍 Students, under the supervision of staff, may leave campus to complete these tasks.
- 📍 Lunch will be provided.
- 📍 Other activities will include letter recognition, music, reading time, exploration, and motor skills.
